Dispels air from needle (Unless performing a Z-Track)	1	
Candidate verbalizes the most common anatomical locations, associated needle sizes for medication administration and maximum amounts that can be given at each location	1	
Verbalize appropriate techniques to use when explaining to the patient the procedure (i.e. on a stuffed animal)	1	
Verbalize when it may be necessary to restrain a patient to perform the injection	1	
Candidate selects injection site, locates correct anatomical position, and cleanses with alcohol	1	
Candidate stabilizes site of injection	1	
Communicates with other providers who may be assisting in the procedure	1	
Insert needle at a 90 degree angle	1
